Verde: Increased and better private landowner engagement over a 3 to 4 year

period

Expanding work in riparian areas (in the planning stages)

Identifying and engaging landowner champions to engage with other

landowners

Lower Gila: Good news is people (diverse stakeholders) are becoming more

engaged, most recently due to challenges over the new expanded flood

plain

Rio Grande: Implemented cut stub treatment, recent designation of Rio Grande

Norte as a national monument

Missouri River/Montana: Upper Missouri Breaks designated as a national monument

On the ground field work successes

Challenges:

Rio Grande: Chemical sensitivity groups are a vocal group

Apathy on part of some partners and stakeholders

Lower Gila: Managing vegetation and managing flood plains

Missouri River/Montana: Getting support from land owners

Dams upstream - restoring natural flows to the monument

Verde: Engaging the local Yavapai-Apache tribe

Development and economic concerns over environmental restoration

At times stakeholders not open minded to change (new science)

Effective and timely coordinated messaging and communication

Lethargic pace of overall compliance

Budget and resources limitations

Multi-jurisdictions (coordinating and developing goals and objectives)

Problem Solving:

Effective timely, coordinated communication

- ✓ Consider professional facilitation
 - Outside mediation
 - o Process design
 - Objective and neutral
 - They bring linkages, best practices and organizational development
- ✓ Find common goal of diverse group of stakeholders
- ✓ Demonstration projects to show common interests and successes
- ✓ Bring groups together (and individual discussions) to promote economic benefits to involvement and coordination
- ✓ Find win-wins
- ✓ Ask and listen to land owner concerns
- ✓ Communicate with landowners and find champions
- ✓ Reframe the message (and who's delivering the message)
